### Things to Do in San Diego — Stephen Brewer Writes:

**Internet:** [SDGLN.com](http://SDGLN.com) is the most widely read news source in the San Diego LGBT Community. They have an events calendar at [sdgln.com/events/](http://sdgln.com/events/). As a matter of full disclosure, I am a columnist for them. The *GLT* ([GayLesbianTimes.com](http://GayLesbianTimes.com)) is the local LGBT print media. They have a nightlife calendar in their “Let’s Go Clubbing” section.

**LGBT-friendly places:** Balboa Park—lots of museums and just fun to walk around. Seaport Village—a tourist trap, but it’s a nice walk along the water with lots of stores to buy small touristy things at. Gaslamp Quarter—most bars and clubs along Gaslamp downtown are gay friendly, though they tend to be a bit pricey.

**LGBT-friendly hangout places downtown:** JSix and LOUNGEsix (616 J Street) and the beach at the W Hotel (421 West B Street). The reality of gay nightlife in San Diego is that our gay ghetto (Hillcrest) is about a 5–10 minute drive north of downtown by taxi and there is little public transportation. Most of the LGBT businesses are along University Avenue between 3rd and Park (about 1 mile long). That being said, here are the nightlife places in Hillcrest that I would recommend visiting:

**Friday:** Top of the Park (525 Spruce Street, 92103)—the weekend starts here for many people with happy hour at 5 p.m. at the top of Park Manor Suites. Gossip Grill—mainly a lesbian bar but open to all, with great fresh food and tasty drinks. Rich’s (1051 University Ave)—the main LGBT club in town, always busy on weekends.

**Saturday:** Martini’s Above Fourth (3940 4th Ave)—a classy martini lounge in the middle of Hillcrest. Rich’s (1051 University Ave)—cover is usually discounted before 11 p.m.

**Sunday Brunch:** Lips (3036 El Cajon)—11 a.m. Gospel Brunch with Drag Queens (it’s a long drive by taxi and recommended only for those with cars or other transportation). There are also a number of wine bars, including Jake’s On 6th, Wine Steals, and The Wine Encounter.
